

### April's Contest...

...was a bit more inventive than normal. The CD -Bill Karp - came up with a format based on three 10 minute flights plus optional reflights limited only by the time. A pilot could on finishing the first four flights line out any one of those flights and refly that 3 pilots did 2 reflights round, optionally repeating as many times as he wanted until a cut-off time of 11:30am.

This contest produced some interesting results. There were 19 planes flown. Two didn't finish. Re-

flights were taken to improve landing scores rather than flight times.

There were 25 reflights:-

2 pilots did 0 zero reflights

9 pilots did 1 reflight

2 pilots did 3 reflights

1 pilot did 4 reflights (I wonder who? Ed)

This works out as an average of 1.47 reflights per pilot, each pilot losing an average of 5:24.

#### **March Meeting Notes**

The March meeting touched on a couple of things - one was that we're running about \$1500 in the bank (time to buy some line? Ed) and some initial plans for a Hand Launch contest before settling into the main topic. This was the fallout from the work that Edgar and colleagues had done with the Delta Darts at Redwood.

Edgar talked about an AMA grant program called 'YES' (Youth Education Stipend) that was designed to seed fund educational projects. If approved a project would be funded up to \$1000 in its first year, \$750 in its second year and \$500 in its third year. No funding would be available after the third year, presumably because its expected that the project would have got off the ground to the point where its self-financing. Edgar's recommendation is that we apply for one of these grants to buy materials for school Dart programs and possilby to buy a couple of robust trainers to allow interested pupils to try flying R/C.

Edgar brought up the subject of criminal background checks. He, as a contractor that works at school sites, is aware of signficant potential liability issues arising from working in a school environment in the current social climate and strongly recommended that anyone contemplating doing any voluntary work in a school obtain a current background check. This raised some somewhat tounge in cheek comments about what the Y2K TOSS membership application should look like (Don't bother looking this month) with the entries for AMA and LSF augmented by file references from the FBI, INS and various
