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

NEWSLETTER AMA FROM NTED REPRI

REPORT ON THE CENTRAL ARIZONA SOARING LEAGUE SOUTHWEST WINTER SOARING CONTEST

(and a Reagan/Wurts flyoff)

This contest was held on Feb.6 and 7 in Mesa Az., and consisted 5.ea Precision/Duration flights and 3 round Triathalon. The awards were for Triathalon; Precision/Duration; First place grand champion, and first place team

Our Club President, Mike Reagan won First Place Grand Champion. Art McNamee won 5th.place - Precision / Duration.

This contest was attended by the FOLLOWING CLUB MEMBERS: Mike Reagan Art McNamee Miles Moran & Edgar. Weisman

The result of our club standing will have to wait until we get the final contest results in the mail, because of a delay in getting a final print-out at the contest site.

The field was a flat, compacted dirt area, that has been mechanically placed and compacted over a landfill. The field is about 1200 feet square and is raised about 15 feet higher than the adjacent farmland.

The contest was very well run. My valuation of performance is the measure of time it takes to complete the tasks. In this meet we had about 116 contestants. The contest started on the first day at 9:00 A.M. and all flights were completed at about 3:00 P.M. This means that about 100 flights were completed per hour.

Mike reagan is in excellent form again. He won this meet with a plane that is only a few weeks old and is completely "scratch built " In fact he cracked the body in half early on the first day of the contest, and had to patch it back together between rounds

After the contest scores were checked it was determined the Mike Reagan and Joe Wurts had to "fly Off" for a tie for 3rd. place in the Precision/Duration part of the contest.

To me this fly off was the most interesting contest of the whole weekend. This little noticed event occured after the contest because of a computer glitch in the scoring. The event went as follows:

Wurts with Perkins timing vs Reagan with Weisman timing.

Both planes were launched from two separate winches, side by side at the same time. (Actually the time of disconnect fron the winch line was about $1\frac{1}{2}$ seconds apart.) The weather was perfect, Warm, about 80 ° F, sunny, with a light breeze about 3 to 5 mph. blowing straight down the landing site, runway type tapes , for a change.

Wurts started circling inverted in the same thermal Reagan was in. (To shake up Reagan ?). (I remembered at this time that I forgot to place a bet on the outcome.)

Both pilots landed at the same time and both planes ended up EXACTLY in the middle of the landing tapes, for perfect landing scores. AND both stop watches, Perkins for Wurts and Weisman for Reagan reading Exactly 3:00 min., except the Reagan was about 3/10ths of on second off 3:00 and Wurts was about 6/10ths of a second off 3:00 min. Reagan won, but as far as I was concerned, the fly off could not have been closer, unless electronic timers were used.

The flyoff was worth the weekend.



DO BE SURE TUBE PASSES THROUGH ROOT RIB













DO END REINFORCEMENTS & SERVO CUTOUTS AT DIFFERENT LOCATIONS. ROUND CUTOUT CORNERS.



DO USE SPARS WITH GRAIN PARALLEL TO THE LONG **DIMENSION & WITH HIGH GRAIN** DENSITY.




DO SPLICE WOOD AT 10:1 ANGLE







DON'T LEAVE SPAR ASS'Y UNWRAPPED




DON'T LEAVE SPAR DOUBLERS SAME LENGTH
