### OLD BUSINESS:




### ATTENDANCE:



### BEGINNER'S PROGRAM

For all you beginners out there who are just starting to fly, here is the unofficial club procedure that we use to train you. Our goal is to safely teach you how to fly with minimum cost/repair time.

You can this guide line to determine where you stand. Take each hurdle and establish a date as to when you desire to be at that level.

Remember you can't rush things. To become a proficient pilot, it takes time, experience and much practice.

STEP 1) If you never built a plane before, ASK FOR HELP. We can help you choose a plane and radio if need be. We can hook you up with someone who has already built at least one of the planes that you have chosen and knows the tricks and pitfalls.

STEP 2) While you are building your plane, come on out to the field. We will be happy to explain what we are doing and why. Also, it is sometimes possible to get a little stick time on someone else plane.

Bring your plane to the Redwood School any Sunday or to any meeting if you have any questions on how to assemble it. NOW is a good time to join the AMA if you haven't. It is MANDATORY that you are a AMA member to fly at any of our fields.

STEP 3) Bring your plane to the Redwood School any Sunday for a flight worthiness/safety check. We will examine your plane to determine what needs to be done before we will attempt to fly it. If the plane passes the check, the batteries are charged, and Mother Nature is willing, we will start your first lessons.

STEP 4) First things first. Since we are going to teach you how to fly on YOUR airplane, we will test your glider by hand tossing to make sure we didn't miss any major problems and to make any necessary in-flight trim adjustments. (Hand tossing should also be done after major crash repairs are made.)

STEP 5) Instructor flies the maiden flight. Sorry about that. We would rather see you go home with a flying plane rather than a bag of balsa parts. At this time we will be making any in-flight trims missed during the first hand toss. We will also be looking for any behavior problems with your plane. Upon landing, any additional adjustments will be made.

STEP 6) We are finally ready to get you some air time. During this phase, the instructor will launch the glider and put it in a stable attitude. He will then give the you the transmitter. He will remain at your side and talk you through learning turns, up/down, straight line travel, stalls and thermals.

If we see that you are trouble, the instructor will take the transmitter away from you. Normally, he will also take the transmitter away at an altitude of 50 to 75 feet and land the plane safely for you.

STEP 7) When you demonstrate the ability of controlling the plane (and your knees stop shaking). You will be allowed to fly closer to the ground, eventually landing your own glider (ANYWHERE on the field is good). The instructor will be at your side in case you get into any trouble.

Don't try to be an expert during this phase and land the plane at your feet. That takes allot of practice. IT IS BETTER TO WALK TO WHERE YOU LANDED YOUR PLANE THAN TO GO HOME WITH A BAG OF PLANE PARTS.

Usually toward the end of this phase, we will have you start launching your own plane. First, we will hold and launch the glider while you steer, then sooner or later you will hold and launch you own.

STEP 8) Learning how to launch your sailplane on a winch. Initially, someone else will launch and control the winch while you control the plane.

STEP 9) Competing in Club contests and achieving your LSF I rating. These are good means for honing your skills.

STEP 10) Optional competing in other club
contests. This is good
because it gives you
exposure to flying at
different conditions than
you are used to.




