Gary reported on the Soaring Masters - Indian summer weather conditions prevailed. All tasks were 12min rounds, no skegs allowed. The LZ was very small and the ground was very hard. Supra's were the most prevalent plane with Onyx' and Pike Perfects showing well. There were many pilots from other countries including Turkey, Czechoslovakia, France, Canada and others. Gary's Supra had mid air when landing and damaged the leading edge of his Supra wing. Launch winches were run all day on Optima truck duty batteries; Gary has a line on two of these for \$50 each. They are lighter than the deep-cycle lead-acid batteries but heavier than the Gel batteries. No retriever winches used! Return of the launch line was by golf carts!

Old Business:

Flying site retention and acquisition:

Bill gave his latest, detailed, flying site acquisition report:

Bill met and discussed our needs with Linda Parks (Ventura County Supervisor) who assisted the Conejo Fliers with their field acquisition at the North East end of Wendy Drive, Thousand Oaks. Their acquisition took close to 6 years to complete. Bill reports that this does not seems to be a productive avenue.

Bill is trying to schedule a meeting with the current Mayor of The City of Thousand Oaks. A Variety of individuals have recommended that club members attend many, many city council meetings and voice our desire for finding a flying site; this apparently is one aspect of how the Conejo Fliers acquired their field.

Hill Canyon – The City of Thousand Oaks has leased 33 acres to a farming concern. There is still a small area left. Currently, the City will not allow us to use the site. Martin will try to find out why the City has had such a drastic turn around from some of the discussions.

Wes Decou (AMA site acquisition) has apparently abandoned our cause.

Mega kudos to Bill for all of his time and hard work that hopefully will benefit all of us.

New Business:

There was a launch incident at the field on Sept 14. The saga unfolded when Mike Carp crashed his plane onto Gainsborough Road after launch. It is suspected that a launch programming setup, CG or tow hook position problem was to blame. In the interest of addressing potential launch difficulties, Don has recommend and drafted a new policy/ procedure. Basically it calls for a safety person, a third person at launch to monitor for safe launch conditions. This procedure really just puts into words the protocols that we already follow; the only addition is the third person. Universal implementation may take a few weekends. A copy of his policy is part of this newsletter.

Meeting adjourned at 8:10PM.


