## Lyme Disease A Threat to Modelers?

Is it a threat? You bet! This year, 1993 is shaping up to be a banner year for the deer tick population, responsible for the tick-borne Lyme disease. Many modelers, especially free flighters and sail plane enthusiasts, come in frequent contact with open fields and grasslands that support deer and rodents that carry the deer tick.

Named for Old Lyme, Connecticut where it was identified in 1975, Lyme disease is a bacterial infection. In about 80% of cases, the first symptom is a target-like bullseye at the site of the bite. Later symptoms include flu-like muscle aches and fever, dizziness and fatigue. Longer term symptoms include memory loss, poor coordination and an irregular heartbeat. Arthritis can set in weeks or even years after the bite.

The deer tick is a tiny black arachnid (not insect) that resembles a pinhead with legs. Lyme disease is thought to be transmitted by the deer tick in its nymphal stage where on your body it most closely resembles a dark freckle.

Following exposure to a tick-infested area, a meticulous body inspection is an effective way of preventing infection. Check your body behind the knees, your hair, armpits and under your watchband. To remove the tick, use a pair of small pointed tweezers to grasp it as close to the skin as possible. Pull it straight back and avoid crushing the body. The odds of becoming ill with Lyme disease increase the longer the tick remains attached to your body.

Precautions can be taken to avoid the deer tick. When flying in possible tick-infested areas, wear long pants and long sleeved shirts. Tuck your pant cuffs into your socks and consider taping the area where the pants and socks meet. Spray insect repellent containing DEET on your clothing and skin (follow directions). Try to keep the area in and around your flying site mowed, when possible, making it harder for the creatures that harbor the ticks to inhabit.

# Toss flying field rules

## FIELD RULES

These are some of the rules that apply to our flying fields. The disobedience of these rules will mean the loss of the flying site.

## ALL LOCATIONS:

- 1) AMA membership and 1991 approved radios are required.
  2) Observe all applicable AMA Safety and Flight regulations.
  3) Beginners should not fly alone.
  4) Guests should be accompanied with a member at all times.
  5) Fields are to be used for the purpose of flying non-

powered R/C Gliders.

- We only have field priority on Sundays. So if you are at any other time, you must yield to the other activities.
   All garbage must be removed at the end of your session.
   Use flight area discretion. In simple terms, don't fly low over houses or people. Beginners fly only over the lower field.
- 4 You must posses a copy of the usage permit at all times.

# PARAMOUNT RANCH:

- Obey all park rules and regulations.
   Use the area (north loop of race track) for all flying sessions.
- 2) The above area is available during regular visitor hours if the area is not in use (by park approved groups).

  3) Do not fly over spectators or low over the road.

  4) The site must be in the same condition as prior to its use. This means that you must remove all garbage that you bring including rubber bands, cups, cans, balsa wood, covering, etc... You are responsible for the separation and recycling of glass and aluminum containers.

  5) You are responsible for security of anything left
- overnight.
- 6) Do not remove, damage, or destroy any items (other than
- J your garbage) without prior park approval.
  Two workshops (Delta Cub Contests) are to be provided by TOSS during the year.
