# TOSS TALK

#### MEETING NOTES OF AUGUST

#### **OLD BUSINESS:**

- 1) Edgar Weisman has picked up the trophies for the club's monthly contest and for the October SC2 contest.
- 2) Charles Babcock (wish we had more guys like him) donated a spool of retriever line. It will be installed during next weekend.
- 3) Edgar Weisman will pick up new winch line so that they may be replaced on all the winches prior to the October SC2 contest.

#### **NEW BUSINESS:**

1) The club's monthly contest in September will be directed by Charles Babcock and Devin Holzer. It will be a more informal contest consisting of one three, five and seven minutes flights each worth one thousand points. Landings will be in or out with scores of plus 50 points or -25 points. The twist is that the timer will not be available to the pilot. Meaning that the pilot will have to estimate his time in the air. Times will be scored on the actual times.

This format led to a discussion among attending members concerning about such a contest would probably discourage non-club members from attending. While some argued that only a very few non-members normally attend for various reasons and any such financial losses would be minimal, the balance argued such a format is not competitive which is the single purpose of having monthly contests. It became apparent as to who was coming out for fun / club support and those who are deeply involved competitors.

It was finally decided that the Contest Director could hold any type of contest as long as it met the club bylaws and that he had the right to change it to a standard format if the conditions at the time beckoned such.

2) A second discussion was spurred from the contest as to why other clubs have more members and can get a higher participation. In conclusion, was determined that the principal reasons were tion and weather. Secondary reasons were

activities available, personnel, types of flying supported and flying sites available.

Geographically, TOSS does not have the population to draw upon like the other clubs in the valley or in San Diego. We certainly have the needed good weather the majority of the time. TOSS has an excellent field at Redwood School and how many other clubs in southern California has a good second thermal field.

Our weak points appear to be personnel (do we really try to make everyone feel like a long lost brother/son or a stranger). TOSS only truly supports thermal flying. But, we have quite a few slope and electric sailplanes flyers in the area that could be interested. As far as activities, there are the usual monthly contests, meetings and raffles. Participation in the activities leaves a bit to be desired.

We would love to hear / read your comments about this subject. Please direct your phone call / letters to Larry Jimenez or Bob Swet.

3) October SC2 Contest - WE NEED YOUR HELP. For any major contest such as SC2 to be a success, there must be a large turnout among the sponsoring club's members to operate winch/retriever, landing, transmitter impound and scoring areas. Typically, a SC2 contest yields 60 to 80 flyers. This dictates the need of approximately 20 support personnel. Even if you have never flown in a contest or participated in one recently, please come out and support your club. Club membership is not a prerequisite. So bring your spouse or responsible children, we really need all the help that we can get. Anyone who shows up will be given an appropriate task. On The Job Training will be provided by an experienced club member. Don't be afraid, show up and you will have allot of fun and learn a little.

#### **AUGUST'S RAFFLE**

Upon vote of the attending members, it was decided not to hold one. Prizes will be used for the August monthly meeting.

#### SEPTEMBER'S MONTHLY CONTEST

The day started off with some good weather and a discussion as to changing the contests format from where the pilot could not use a timer to where he could. Attending pilots were TOSS members only and they were split down the middle as to which format was to be held. Serious flyers requested timers and fun flyers said no.

Contest Director, Charles Babcock, finally yielded to pressure and allowed the use of timers by the pilots. Any ties at the end would be determined by a flight of predetermined length where the pilots could not use a timer. With political matters put away, an excellent, challenging contest was held. For their very first time of being contest directors, Charles Babcock and Devin Holzer did a very good job!




The question will you C/D a contest for us next year? By then you'll be one of us (a senior member) and be part of the majority vote!
